Major Items of note:

1. <u>Long Range Facilities Plan</u> (LRFP)

The Planning Team continues to updat e the LRFP Action Plan to track planning actions, facilities decisions of the Board of Education and potential or recommended changes for the next revision of the LRFP in 2023 .

The proposed expansion projects at Brighouse and Talmey Elementary, contained in the past four Capital Plan submiss ions, have not yet been supported by MECC . The Planning Team met with the MECC Capital Management team on 25 April 2023 to discuss the need fo r timely Ministry support of capital expansion projects in the City Centre Area . The meeting also reviewed land us e strategies impacting growth trends in the District and projections , based on local knowledge on development activity, Metro Vancouver Regional **Growth Strategy** and City Centre Area Plan and Official Community Plan for City of Richmond for capital project approval s to address the rapid enrolment growth There is an urgency , growing lack of space for portables and further meetings with space shortfall and in City Centre school sites MECC are being planned.
