### INTRODUCTION

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### Continued Education Assistan(EA)Shortages

HR staff monitodaily EA absences, dispatches and unfilled EA absences. Since March, the daily average of EA absences has been 69. However, the daily average OaDEAs picking up shifts to cover absences has been 27. Consequently, the district continues to experitarily unfilled EA assignments at an average of 42/day spread across all school and learning center sites.

d Z ] • š d Hiling daily EAabsences is notingularly result of having too few EAs available on the OnCall roster. Rather, the difficulty is that not all available to all EAs are picking up work each day. As of March 2024, the district to 100 OnCall EAs deemed available for daily work as replacement EAs. 18 of these are currently assigned to temporary positions, which leaves 73 available to fill daily absences, which as noted above visically 69.

HR staff continue to apply significant efforts to recruit and hire Carl EAsout also are focused on understanding why not all On Call EAs are accepting daily work, as well as what more staff can do to ensure On Call EAs are accepting all available daily work, example staff are implementing an engagement survey for Or all staff to gather insights about their experience and why they are not accepting work. The result of this can then guide next steps to respond to this ongoing matter.
